

Don't get stuck with a seat belt ticket.



Extra seat belt enforcement on Minnesota roads, October 8-28, 2010

Distracted drivers. Speeders. Impaired drivers. You've seen them on our roads – and a seat belt is your best defense! Why?

- It holds you in the protective space built into your vehicle and gives you room to live if there's a crash.
- It helps you maintain control by keeping you correctly positioned behind the wheel.

Remember: Buckle up for every ride and require your passengers to do the same.



Minnesota's primary seat belt law allows law enforcement to stop and ticket motorists solely for seat belt violations. Drivers and all passengers must be buckled up or in the correct child restraint. A seat belt fine can be more than \$100.

Minnesota's child passenger safety law requires children to ride in a booster seat once they've outgrown their car seat (usually around age 4) until age eight. Children should remain in a booster until they are 4 feet 9 inches tall.
